



## Sixth Grade Supply List

### Ancient History – Mr. Dornan

- 1” binder, 6 dividers, & loose-leaf paper (college or wide ruled) OR a 1-2 subject notebook
- Folder with clasps (not needed if using a binder)

### Earth Science – Mr. Blessing

- 1” binder, 6 dividers, & loose-leaf paper (college or wide ruled) OR a 1-2 subject notebook
- Folder with clasps (not needed if using a binder)
- 12 inch ruler and protractor

### Intro. to Latin – Mr. Dornan

- 1” binder, 6 dividers, & loose-leaf paper (college or wide ruled) OR a 1-2 subject notebook
- Folder with clasps (not needed if using a binder)
- Index cards (lined or blank, colored or white)
- Designated place to store index cards (could be a 3-ring binder pencil pouch or a plastic or metal container, such as this one: [index card storage box](#))

### Literature (Great Books) – Mr. Dornan

- 1” binder, 6 dividers, & loose-leaf paper (college or wide ruled) OR a 1-2 subject notebook
- Folder with clasps (not needed if using a binder)
- *Tales of Greek Heroes* by Roger Lancelyn Green (summer reading requirement)
- *The Lion, The Witch, & The Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis (this will be needed in September)
- Multiple novels will be needed throughout the school year. The instructor will inform families when to purchase each. Amazon links are provided, but books can be purchased anywhere. Purchasing used books is the most economical option (no abridged versions).

### Math – Ms. Pisciotta

- 1-2 subject notebook
- Folder with clasps for handouts
- Ruler
- Calculators are NOT needed.

### Music – Mrs. Horvath

- 1” binder (for Music class only) with 3 dividers and loose-leaf paper (30 sheets of college or wide ruled)
- sharpened graphite and colored pencils, highlighter, eraser

### Physical Education/Healthy Living – Coach Cottle

- PE uniform (for daily P.E.) - the link to purchase will be sent in July
- Athletic shoes (any color/style athletic shoes) – it is recommended that students have a pair of school uniform shoes and a pair of P.E. shoes
- Fitness journal – this can be a one subject notebook; a small, handheld journal, etc.

### Spelling/Grammar – Mrs. Noland

- 1” binder, 6 dividers, & loose-leaf paper (wide or college-ruled)



Theology (Great Bible Stories) – Mrs. Noland

- Required textbook: [Great Adventure Catholic Bible Chronicles](#)
- A five-subject notebook with divider tabs
- A folder (with clasps & 6 adhesive divider tabs) OR ½” binder with 6 dividers for handouts

Other recommendations to be used across multiple classes:

- Student planner - it should have ample daily/weekly writing space in the monthly calendar sections.
- Pencil pouch/container (something easy to transport outside of backpack)
- Pencils (wooden or mechanical for most classes)
- Black and/or blue pens
- 1 pack of colored pencils, crayons, colored gel pens, OR fine tip markers
- Erasers (pencil top and/or handheld)
- Extra loose-leaf paper for binders (wide or college-ruled)
- Glue stick or glue dots
- Small pair of scissors
- Tape in a dispenser (such as Scotch tape found in a plastic dispenser)
- Highlighters (3 different colors)
- If students do not prefer to write in books (for annotation purposes), they may instead purchase writable sticky note tags/flags.

Notes:

- Supplies are not needed until the first full week of school (Aug. 12).
- All students are responsible for their own supplies. Student supplies can be organized as they find most helpful for each class, but teachers will provide guidance at the beginning of the year.
- When choosing supplies, please be mindful that the lockers are small, and it will be difficult to fit one binder for each class. Choosing a few notebooks instead of binders is recommended.
- If students choose binders, they can be any type (hard, soft, zipped, Velcro, etc.).
- Subjects taught by the same teacher and/or related subjects (i.e. history/Latin; theology/grammar) may be combined in 2”- 4” binders with clear division & organization b/t subjects.
- Backpacks are recommended but will be stored in lockers. Rolling backpacks are not permitted.
- Students may decorate their lockers minimally. Locker shelves are highly recommended. Locks for lockers are not permitted.
- At the beginning of school, teachers will distribute a class syllabus. This will list any reading material that needs to be purchased (if not already listed above).
